Happy Juneteenth - A Message from NEWPF





Northeast Women in Public Finance stands in support of the African American Community and would like to acknowledge and celebrate Juneteenth. Juneteenth is symbolic as it commemorates the official end of slavery after the Civil War. Although President Abraham Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation declared that slaves were free on January 1, 1863, many slave owners in dissenting states did not recognize the proclamation. It wasn't until two years later, June 19th, 1865 when Major General Granger traveled to Galveston, Texas to ensure the remaining enslavers comply with the President's directive that Juneteenth became the symbolic date representing African American freedom.

Our country is currently at a turning point. As we grapple with the unjust deaths of Ahmaud Arbery, Breona Taylor, George Floyd, Rayshard Brooks, and countless others; we are sickened, angry and saddened at the senseless acts of inhumanity. We feel compelled to condemn injustice and discrimination recognizing that it is not enough to simply be "not a racist" anymore, allies and advocates must actively be "anti-racist". We must continue to listen and learn from one another in safe and inclusive environments with respect for different backgrounds and perspectives.

As an organization we want to reinforce our message of solidarity with the African American community and reaffirm our commitment to a diverse and inclusive environment. Northeast Women in Public Finance will continue to amplify and elevate people of color.
